ACTION GROUP REPORTS:

Barwon Region Action Group: B.R.A.G. is a major sponsor of the Emu Creek Showjumping Festival so we are encouraging anyone under 17 to promote the day and the talents of their versatile Connemara ponies.

In October a keen band of B.R.A.G. members make their way to Penny Brown's Celtic Stud at Maroona. We were very fortunate in seeing two stallions new to Victoria. Glenormiston Slipper a stallion full of pony character and charm and Wychwood Snowbird

who will cross well with Penny's mares. Penny and her sister Suzie were very congenial hosts and made the day a perfect opportunity to catch up on news as well as feast our eyes on Penny's mares and foals.

Central Victorian Action Group: The Central Victorian Group has been planning ahead for next year's Connemara Showcase to be held in September. They have held another training day with Manoalo Mendez which has proved very popular with Connemara pony enthusiasts.

The CPBSA has recently received correspondence from a private group of owners and breeders currently undertaking research into a condition in Connemaras termed Hoof Wall Separation Syndrome (HWSS). Further research is being undertaken at UC Davis (America) and it is anticipated that some DNA results will be available by the end of the year.

The hypothesis at this stage is that it is the result of a recessive gene and when two carriers are bred, there is a 25% chance of producing an affected foal. There seems to be varying degrees of severity with no cure. Mildly affected ponies can be managed while serious cases have resulted in euthanasia. The condition appears from photos and explanations to be a separation of the hoof wall with the ponies hoof chipping upwards from the sole. Affected ponies essentially end up standing on their sole.

I hope as many members as possible can get to attend, participate or just support Jean Dart and Annette Gardner's Connemara Pony Showcase committee. I have been able to submit articles to overseas Connemara Pony Magazine publications An Capallain and Connemara Pony review for 2012, and was thrilled to be able to include some lovely photos submitted by the Performance Register winners and

ITEMS FROM COMMITTEE MEETING

Performance Register: Catherine gave an overview of the first year of this award system, talked about Bronze, Silver and Gold Awards being introduced. New scoring sheet will be issued once members have been asked for feedback.

Constitution: John gave an overview on the changes suggested by Committee. Constitution changes will be sent to all members for consideration.

Promotional Brochure: photos to be sent to either John or Bob Plummer for collage of photos on ponies for an information pamphlet on the breed this will be used for distribution to Pony & Riding Clubs.

Strategic Plan: Catherine spoke on this, covers 5 areas for review, this will be placed on the web-page in members only section for any members who wish to comment.

Action Groups: all members of the committee of Action Groups should be members of the CPBSA.

Jo Heard Trophy: Itsa Shamrock Cutie Pie was announced as the winner of this year's award.

Inspection Workshops: new approach to inviting people who are interested in becoming members of our Inspection Panel – clinics will be held allowing new Inspectors to do a "dummy run" under the supervision of Karen Holloway. This Sunday will be the first of such in Victoria, with a session being held at Teesdale.

ICCPS Meeting: Karen is on the executive of the ICCPS; need to send a list of the Inspectors for approval so our Inspectors can judge and inspect ponies overseas.

100 year anniversary of Michael O'Malley's introduction of the Connemara Pony into Ireland, this celebration will be worldwide – our contribution will be to have a promotion at the Showcase in 2012.

Insurance: looking into various options; needs to be in place by the end of September, probably stay with EA.

Sponsorship for awards from Studs around Australia; we are going to ask EU for sponsorship; Connemara Pony are a rare breed of pony.

Karen Holloway was re-elected President for a further term.

Catherine McTaggart was elected Vice-President.

I would like to thank the CPBSA Committee; Gary Johnston, Sue Clarke, John Tennant, Catherine McTaggart, James Crowley, Janene Leslie, Zita Denholm, Gil Beaton, Ingrid Rowe, Jayne Ramaker Jo Longman and its members for supporting me in my first year as President. I have enjoyed working with state and federal reps in this last year and feel positive and excited about the year to come.

Our biggest financial investment in the last 12 months was to see the launch and completion of our Performance Register. I wish to thank the Performance registrar Catherine McTaggart, Vicki Plummer our Society secretary and state reps for assisting in the co-ordination of information and assistance to our members, which has resulted in the register having a total of 76 entrants in its first year. It was something of which I have been very proud to be a part of and now we will be able to promote the results to the wider equine fields and congratulate the winners and participants. I feel the register allows our ponies to be recognised by our society for their performance in breed specific and open company, and acknowledging the part-bred inclusion, also promotes the performance ability of the Connemara Pony. I look forward to seeing the register grow and become a great part of our society in which we can show off our ponies and keep in touch with our members.

I am also happy to report the amnesty held earlier in the year on foal recordings was successful with new registrations being able to occur and new memberships in our society. I would hope that our membership will also grow in the areas of lost ponies with our state representatives and current members now having an awareness of the ability to include lost ponies that are able to be verified through our DNA process.

I am always asked on the statistics of our society, and gave a small introductory talk to the Irish and International Guests of the Connemara Pony in the Abbeyglan Hotel held in Clifden, Ireland in August of this year. I was happy to report that in the last year our society has; 160 members of which 120 are full members, we have 50 working stallions, we had 50 mares that bred, and the foals recorded for the year were 106. Our society also had recorded in our studbook over the years of 20 stallions, and a total

of 80 mares as imported, with 2 colts being imported in the last 2 years. In comparison to some of the EU countries, we have good growth showing as the Norwegian delegate informed me they had only recorded 10 foals for the last year.

Our classification system and inspections are approved by the CPBS mother society and we are now the only recognised holder of the Connemara Pony Studbook in Australia by the CPBS. This decision has been approved by the CPBS council earlier this year, after a submission from me as a delegate of the CPBSA to the CPBS in Ireland the previous year. Further recognition of this status most recently was also given by the International Connemara Pony Society, in August this year. I believe this recognition will protect our members, our herd and future of the Connemara Pony in Australia.

We have continued to hold education sessions on Connemara ponies for pony inspectors and members in South Australia, New South Wales and Victoria, and again I would like to thank all Committee and members who assisted in these various sessions to enable the session to occur. We are a small society and volunteering is both personal and financial in some cases and as President I am very proud of the increased level of people's time and effort in our society of the last 12 months.

I would like to make special thanks to Mr Bob Plummer our Secretary's husband for his ongoing unpaid support to Vicki and his own expertise and input into our new ventures with items such as the E-Bulletin, online voting, and general support to all who contact their home/office. I would like to acknowledge the extra unpaid time that Vicki herself puts into her role, as our society has taken on these extra ventures in the last 12 months. Thank you to you both.

The future of the Connemara Pony in Australia I believe will be well served by the current society committee, future plans include promotion, sponsorship, strategic planning, security and support of breed standards. I look forward too continuing my role as President achieving our goals and getting around to seeing as many ponies and members as possible in the next year.
